N.B. The enclosed topics are merely what we would like to cover. Please note that as an Independent school, we enjoy the flexibility to explore any other interesting area of learning that may arise during the term, and therefore the list should be taken as a guide only.

ENGLISH

- o Continue developing independent writing.
- o Study the creative world of fantasy, traditional tales, poetry and recounts.
- o Consolidate and introduce further phonics in Read Write Inc.
- o Continue to develop a cursive script.
- o Continue grammar and punctuation.

MATHEMATICS

- o Consolidate and extend topics studied.
- o Continue with capacity, read time to half hour (analogue and digital).
- o Continue work on place value.
- o Recognise coins, find totals and give change up to 20p and beyond.
- o Problem solving.
- o Using numerical processes with numbers to 20 and beyond.
- o Online Maths tasks using MyMaths.

SCIENCE

- o Forces – find and describe the movement of familiar things.
- o Understand that pushes and pulls are examples of forces.
- o Plants – recognise that plants need light and water to grow.
- o Recognise and name the main parts of a flowering plant and that seeds grow into them.

ART & DESIGN

- o Cover a range of activities using different textures, materials and techniques.
- o Study the life and work of Van Gogh.
- o Observational drawings.
- o Link with topics – plants and toys.
- o Sewing.

FRENCH

- o Numbers.
- o Sports.
- o Family.
- o Colours.
- o Stories, songs, rhymes and games.

GEOGRAPHY

- o Explore similarities and differences between own locality and the Isle of Coll (the fictional Isle of Struay in the Katie Morag books).
- o Compare landscapes, weather, people and transport on Coll with own locality.

HISTORY

- o How are our toys different from the past?
- o Similarities and differences between toys today and in the past.
- o Look at concept of 'old' and 'new'.

COMPUTING

- o Using own login to save, access and print own work.
- o Create images using drawing tools.
- o Continue to develop keyboard skills.
- o Use a variety of programs to develop Literacy, Maths, Science and Geography topic work.

MUSIC

- o Exploring pitch and rhythm through sound and notation
- o Singing songs from around the world.
- o Videoing and assessing musical performances.

P. E.

- o Swimming – water skills, introduction to deep water, water confidence and safety awareness.
- o Games – develop bat and ball skills.
- o Dance – develop and extend basic dance actions.
- o Gym – travelling, stretching and tucking.

P.S.H.C.E.

- o Understanding and managing our feelings.
- o Making choices and knowing how they might change in the future.
- o Overcoming obstacles that might get in the way of changes in behaviour.
