<p><b><u>Snail Trail</u></b> Enjoy using the snail trail around Brighton and Hove. Take pictures and stick the map into your Homework Book. Think of a way in which you can replicate it in an artistic way. For example, using a 3D model, sketch or water colour.</p>	<p><b><u>Directional language</u></b> Learn to give clear directions to a member of the family from one part of the house to another. Include vocabulary such as left, right, forwards, backwards, stop, turn, clockwise or anticlockwise. Take pictures and stick in Homework Book.</p>
<p><b><u>Map work</u></b> Find a map of Brighton and Hove on the Internet. Print it off and find your home, school and important landmarks within Brighton and Hove. Stick in your Homework Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Habitats</u></b> Research different animal habitats. Design and create a habitat for an animal of your choice.</p>	<p><b><u>Research</u></b> Find a menu of a Victorian feast. King George liked some crazy foods! Record your findings in your Homework Book and be ready to talk through the menu with the class.</p>
<p><b><u>Research</u></b> Research one of Brighton's famous historical figures, e.g. Dr Russell, King George or Martha Gunn. Write down 5 facts related to them in your Homework Book ready to share with the class.</p>	<p><b><u>Computing</u></b> Create a poster advertising the Royal Pavilion. Use attractive text, colours and pictures.  Stick in your Homework Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Music</u></b> Make a rap or a song about Brighton and Hove and be ready to perform to the year group. Try to include historical facts! Make sure it is fun and there is a copy in your Homework Book.</p>
