Cross-curricular topic: The Body

Preparing children for life



English

- Continue to develop independent writing skills.
- Introduce descriptive poetry, recounts, lists and instructions.
- Continue grammar and punctuation.
- · Reading at School and home.
- Consolidate and introduce further phonics in Read, Write Inc.
- Continue to develop handwriting skills.

Mathematics

- Consolidate reading and writing of numerals to at least 20.
- Continue work on place value.
- Adding, subtracting, doubles and near doubles. Mental maths.
- Reading lists and tables.
- Money: recognise coins and equivalent values to at least 20p.
- Problem solving and measuring.
- Online maths tasks using MyMaths.

Science

- Topic The Body. What is alive and what is not?
- The senses, naming and labelling different parts of the interior and exterior body, including bones, muscles, lungs and hearts.
- Healthy eating.
- Sound and hearing.

Computing

- Starting the computer, logging on.
- Use of drawing and painting software to develop mouse control.
- Keyboard skills and Topic work.
- Programming with Bee-Bots.
- E-Safety staying safe online.

Art and Design

- Introduce a range of activities using Activities using different textures, materials and techniques.
- Try to create own dips and dippers.
- Link with topics: The Body, Winter, Houses and Homes, celebrations including Chinese New Year and Easter.
- To include observational drawings.

French

- Revisit numbers to 21, saying how old you are and the alphabet.
- Brothers and sisters, pets.
- Days of the week, months of the year.
- Stories, songs, rhymes and games.
- Easter activities.

Geography

- Farm features.
- · Maps and keys
- Farm seasons.
- Trip to Plumpton Agricultural College, Lewes.

History

- Look at the similarities and differences between homes today and in the past.
- Look at features of buildings, household objects and stories about home life.
- Link to Art and Design and English.

Music

- Guitars: D, A, G and E chords. Open string pieces and chord changing.
- · Music for Class Assembly.
- Recorder songs from Charanga.
- · Music for Easter Service.

PE

- Swimming: improving stroke techniques and pool safety.
- Select practised movements.
- Development of throwing and catching, extending to striking actions.
- Dance Movement, rhythm and basic choreography.

PSHE

- Continued learning on MAGIC.
- Philosophy throughout the curriculum.
- Citizenship, behaviour with peer groups.
- · Self-awareness and motivation.
- Exploring feelings and developing self-confidence.

Religious Studies

- Christian, non-Christian and festivals, including Chinese New Year, Mothering Sunday and the Easter story.
- Understand Christian beliefs through stories.

PHILOSOPHY lessons will take place approximately every 3 weeks. Philosophical themes and ideas will be considered and discussed.
