London



Preparing children for life



English

- Continue to develop cursive handwriting skills, especially letter joins
- RWI: consolidate and progress through Set 2 and 3 sounds. Work on building and editing sentences
- Spelling: develop understanding of prefixes, suffixes, plurals and alternative vowel phonemes
- Sentence level skills including continuing to use conjunctions and adjectives and developing editing skills to check and improve work
- Reading and writing across a range of genres e.g non-chronological reports, stories with familiar settings, poetry, recounts in the form of diaries

Mathematics

- Addition and subtraction of one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20 and beyond
- Missing number problems
- Recognise and find a half and a quarter
- Read and write numbers in numerals and words
- Read time to quarter to and past the hour
- Describe position using half, quarter and three-quarter turns

Science

Seasonal Changes – Spring to Summer

- Naming and describing different types of weather

Everyday Materials

- Identifying materials and their uses
- Describing and comparing properties of materials
- Planning and conducting an investigation

Computing

- Programming with Beebots
- Word processing skills
- Saving and accessing own work
- Use iPads to take photos and tell stories
- Recording digital footage and creating animations/slideshows
- Programming with Scratch Jnr

Art and Design

- Develop sketching skills
- Develop a wide range of techniques using colour and texture
- Junk modelling to recreate famous landmarks

French

- Numbers

Geography

- Use a variety of resources to locate where London is in comparison to Brighton
- Recognise and learn about famous London landmarks
- Develop mapping skills
- Features of physical and human landscapes

History

- Use a variety of resources to learn about The Great Fire of London
- Find out why events happened and what changes were made as a result
- Learn about Samuel Pepys

Music

- Steady beat, pitch and dynamics using games and movement
- Learning rhythm patterns on percussion using visuals
- Active listening and responding to music (composer of the month)
- Songs from topic and time of year

PE

- Swimming – water skills, introduction to deep water, water confidence and safety awareness
- Striking and fielding games – further develop bat and ball skills
