	Design and create	Research a recipe and following the instructions create a Viking inspired dish. Take a photo or bring in a sample!	Observational drawing: find a plant of your choice and draw/paint it and label its different parts.	
	Success Criteria	I can research a Viking recipe. I can follow a set of instructions. I can reflect on my finished produce.	I can find a live plant to observe. I can choose materials to create my plant (draw, paint, build). I can label the plant's different features. I can research the function of different parts of the plant.	
	Out and about	Using the materials around you, create a structure that resembles a Viking boat.	Go outside and identify 5 different types of plants (taking pictures of them as you go). Present your work with the pictures you took, the name of the plants and a short explanation about each of them.	
	Success Criteria	I can collect a range of materials. I can research a Viking boat. I can plan and design my model. I can build a model.	I can take pictures of 5 different plants. I can identify these plants using the Internet or books. I can explain how to spot these plants by identifying distinguishing features.	
	Let's perform	Choose a poem related to one of this term's philosophical themes: happiness; secrets; honesty and choices in life. Perform the poem and either record or perform to the class.
