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YEAR 3 TRIP TO BUTSER FARM

On Wednesday, 28th September, Year 3 visited Butser Ancient Farm to learn about the Anglo-Saxons from hands-on experiences. During the day we completed four different activities. For each activity, our guide asked us questions and helped us to understand how and why the Anglo-Saxons had worked or acted in this way. Our first task was to work together to build a wattle fence using bendy hazel wood. Later on in the day we then helped to mix up some clunch using hay, soil, chalk and water. We used this to cover a wattle fence. It was rather mucky work! We came away with two souvenirs- an engraved piece of chalk and a piece of jewellery. To create our chalk lucky charms we had to colour them using natural dye from leaves before using flint to carve out a pattern or initial. Our jewellery creations were made by twisting flexible wire with a pair of pliers; we then fashioned them into either a bracelet, ring or ear cuff.

The day was thoroughly enjoyable and we came away with a much more in-depth understanding of life in Anglo-Saxon times.




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YEAR 4 TRIP TO MICHELHAM PRIORY

After settling in, the children were separated into groups for workshops. Half of the children were taken into the kitchen, where they used a pestle and mortar to grind pungent spices – it was a tricky task! The other half were able to learn all about dining – Tudor style! Following on from this, the children had several other workshops, such as engraving clay tiles and creating lavender bags. Their favourite activity was using quills and ink to write letters to Henry VIII. In the afternoon, the children had the opportunity to re-enact history itself, as they took on the role of Henry VIII, his wives and his associates. It was impressive to see the children perform with such gusto! Overall, it was an incredibly inspiring and memorable day for Year 4.


FOW NEWS
