Extra-curricular Activities

Ocean View Diving

This term, we have joined up with Ocean View Diving to offer pupils over the age of 8 an introductory session to Scuba in our school pool. Ocean View is a well-established PADI Dive Centre based in Lancing. They have recently expanded and now have a centre in Brighton Marina.

Ocean view will be sending 2-3 instructors to run a series of introductory sessions on Monday nights. These Bubblemaker sessions offer an entry level accredited avenue into the wonders of the underwater world. Under close supervision by a PADI Instructor, pupils learn to use scuba gear before being allowed to swim around and have fun.

We hope to be able to offer a longer 5 session course for pupils to complete the PADI Seal Team course with more detailed units to become a PADI Seal Team member. For pupils in Year 6, this could lead to a move to PADI Junior Open Water. For our younger pupils, they can progress onto the Master Seal Team Programme.

As these sessions start at 16:30, pupils can go to Windlefun first and have their snack in order to be on time to start their session. If parents would like to come and watch, please do so in the second hour when the children will be in the pool after having run through the theory. Sessions finish at 18:30. Reporter: Mrs Fox
