## Year 6 Library Prefects' intrepid book journey

Our Year 6 Library Senior Prefects thoroughly enjoyed their recent trip to Waterstones in Brighton. We set off in the comfort of our school mini bus, laden with special delivery boxes. We embarked on a 'behind the scenes tour' with Richard, our guide, who was astonished by the wealth of knowledge our Library Prefects have regarding the skills involved in writing.

The luxury of being in an empty store allowed pupils to quickly find their favourite authors and to discover new ones. We discussed how publishing a book is a collaborative experience involving the writer, illustrators, editors-in-chief and marketing staff and how it can take up to two years for a story to evolve from an idea to a book on the shelf.

Whilst enjoying a hot chocolate, we wrote reviews about some of our favourite books. These comments are now on the shelves at the store, for all to see. Each of our library prefects received a book of their choice as a gift from Waterstones - a wonderful surprise for them.

The second part of our trip involved heading to Brighton College with a delivery we were extremely proud to hand over. Last year, we formed a link with Brighton College and the registered charity, 'Reading Spots'. Reading Spots, formed by youth and teacher volunteers in the UK and in Ghana, supports the creation of community libraries in Ghana. The organisers strive to improve the very limited access children and adults have to books, and to develop educational opportunities in literacy, especially for children. The libraries are managed by Ghanaians and are entirely self-sufficient after their creation. Our prefects discussed this project with Richard, and Waterstones very kindly provided some books to be shipped out with our donations.

Windlesham School is proud to be part of global 'book re-cycling', where books our pupils have already read are being shared by children in distant lands. Thank you to all our children who enthusiastically boxed up books and sent messages. A special thank you to the staff at Waterstones, Brighton College and to Mr Lyle, our school site manager, who worked hard to brush the snow off the mini bus and safely escort us on our intrepid book journey!

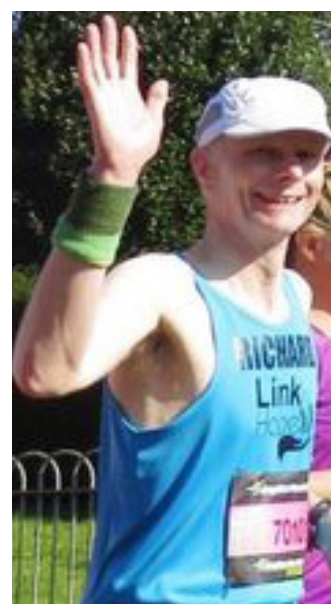
### Mr Ferries - running the Brighton marathon, again!

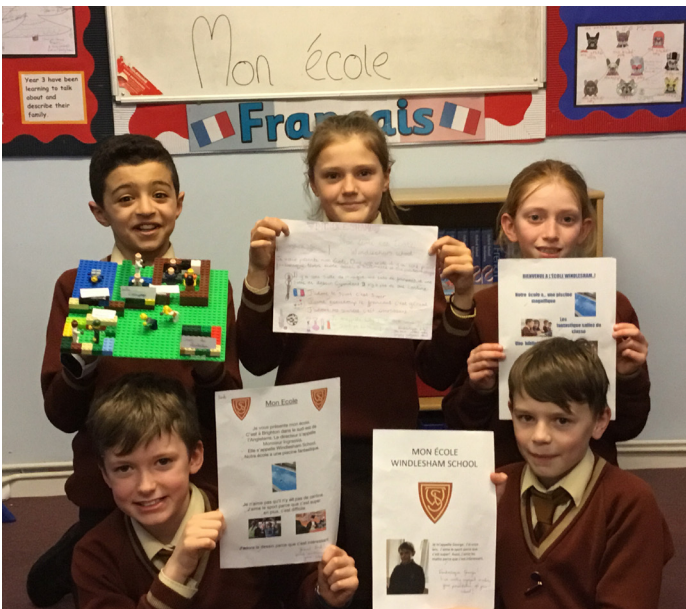
## Voici mon école

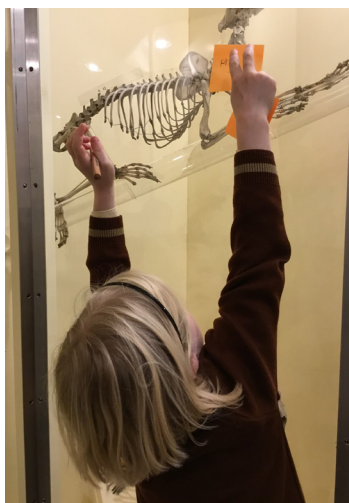


# School Activities
