A broader update on our collaboration with the registered charity, Reading Spots, is that there are now 17 community-led projects in Ghana; hosting vacation reading clinics, health walks and drama clubs, all run by local volunteers committed to improving educational opportunities for those in their community.

Our children always look forward to boxing up the books, writing messages for the Ghanaian children to read and are proud to be actively engaged in such a worthwhile enterprise. Thank you for all your book donations and support.
