## Uniform - a few gentle reminders

We have allowed a transition period of two years from the old to the new uniform, hoping that most children will have swapped over in the first year. However, we request that when you do swap to the new uniform you make it a complete change. Please do not mix items of old uniform with the new. If you were waiting on items from Sussex Uniforms, I am informed that they are all in.

In addition, if you purchased an elasticated tie and the elastic has stretched excessively, Sussex Uniforms are

able to swap the tie for a new version with a stronger elastic.

Also, please be reminded that children this term should be in winter uniform, which includes long trousers.

Lastly, please ensure that your child has a coat in school every day during the autumn and winter months so that they can enjoy being outside during their breaks.

# Notices from the Head

## Fee payment fraud alert

Parents with children attending independent schools are being approached by emails which appear to have originated from the school. Payment instructions for school fees are provided, often offering discounts for prompt payment. The beneficiary accounts quoted direct the funds to accounts under the fraudster's control. Banks have seen emails received by parents sent from the correct school email address and quoting the child's name. It is possible that the school's email account has been hacked either driven by a password compromise or malware infection. In these circumstances, it is usually the parent making the payment who will be responsible for the loss. By the time the fraud is identified, in most instances, the funds will have been moved on and cannot be recovered. This has not happened at Windlesham to date, however please be vigilant and observe the following advice:

Other than the usual invoices from Windlesham, always verify an email payment request directly with the school, via myself on the school phone number 01273 553645

Be alert to unexpected fee requests

Do not attempt to verify the instruction by replying to the email or by making contact with a phone number included in the email

Be particularly vigilant when you are being asked to send payments to new or different bank accounts other than that normally used by the school

Check for inconsistencies and grammatical errors in emails, such as a misspelt school name or a slightly different

### **Parking**

Please continue to help park responsibly along Dyke Road and the surrounding areas when you pick-up and drop-off children. Please pay particular attention to parking restrictions on zig zag lines, disabled bays and the Fairways Estate. This is much appreciated by the school and by our neighbours.





### Online group chats

As we have just completed Anti-bullying week, it seems apt to offer some advice about online group chats among children. The skill of managing ones' self online takes maturity and confidence, particularly the skill of withdrawing yourself from conversations which make you uncomfortable. For these and many other reasons, we recommend that children at primary school age are restricted to chats with individuals and that when group chats first begin, parents and carers are included in the group. In the coming weeks we will be offering more helpful tips to keep your children safe in their cyberworld.

At Windlesham School, eSafety is an important part of the curriculum. It features in computing lessons and PSHE.lessons.
