

Safeguarding update

Windelsham School is determined to maintain what is deemed to be best practice in safeguarding policy. In accordance with Education Department recommendations, from January 2019 Windlesham School will subscribe to Operation Encompass. This is a joint project with Sussex Police in which the police provide early reporting to schools of any domestic abuse incidents involving children (incidents in which a



child was present, ordinarily resides at the incident location or with an involved party).

From the police, 'We know that children and young people can be significantly affected through witnessing or being exposed to domestic abuse and this operation will allow our school to better support our pupils/students and their families. A nominated member of school staff, known as a Key Adult, will be trained to liaise with the police.'

Our Key Adult will be Mrs Fox, our Designated Safeguarding Lead and the Deputy Key Adult is Mr Ingrassia, also our Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead. They will be able to use information that has been shared with them, in confidence, to ensure that the right support is available should it be required by a child/young person and/or their family. We are keen to offer the best support available to our pupils and we believe this is going to be extremely beneficial for all those involved.






It's been a busy term for FOW with lots of fun activities for parents, carers and children. We started the term with our Parents Social followed by a series of fundraising activities.
