## New House Points system

This term we have rejuvenated the House Point System. You may have noticed in the children's planners and reading record books (Years 1 to 6), they now have a record sheet tied into our 5 school values to record acquired points. When a child is awarded a House Point the member of staff will stamp, date and initial the House Point to allow for a quick weekly collation.

We hope to incentivise the pupils with a tiered system of certificates and with each certificate, pupils will also gain a golden ticket which will be entered into a termly draw.

Bronze (15 points) Silver (30 points) Gold (45 points) Platinum (60 points) Diamond (75 points)

### Social media

Although the benefits of social media are often celebrated, and rightly so, I am also mindful that users who are just beginning to experiment with it, often in Years 5 and 6, are unlikely to be aware of the many pitfalls.

When children first begin to participate in chat groups, they generally do not have the skills to regulate their tone, to withdraw from uncomfortable conversations, to remove themselves from unpleasantness and to stand up to wrongs expressed by their peers.

These common errors of judgement can have quite damaging consequences on the confidence of participants, on their friendship groups and their mental health.

For this reason I would strongly recommend to any parents who allow their children to participate in chat groups please regularly monitor your children's devices.

of a term, will be raised with Mrs Tasker-Hill, the Chair of FOW. One of the functions of FOW is to facilitate a link between parents and the school. Mrs Tasker-Hill will then instruct the class reps who will notify you by email inviting you to respond to them by email.

Mrs Tasker-Hill will collate all the questions and in many cases will be able to answer these directly. If not, questions will be passed on to me. I will then return responses to Mrs Tasker-Hill as promptly as I can manage. If you wish your identity to remain anonymous, please let your class rep know.

At Windlesham School we encourage strong communication between school and home, The Parents' Forum will permit this to happen through a more formal channel.

#### **Thursday 5th March**


