A big well done goes to our Year Six Wildlife and Sustainability Reps, Daniel, Arabella and Sophia, who have completed an RSPB Wild Challenge. As part of the importance of awareness for Wildlife and Sustainability Windlesham School has joined the RSPB's school awards scheme, supporting school-based learning and enabling pupils to apply curriculum knowledge and skills to each task.

Each Wild Challenge helps children to connect with and learn about nature and to develop resilience, responsibility and team working skills. For this Wild Challenge we have designed natural bird feeders using pine cones and willow structures, mixing sunflower hearts, dried fruit, dried insects and wild bird seed with suet, making a tasty meal for our local wildlife. We are soon to achieve our first award, the Bronze Certificate. Well done Wildlife and Sustainability Reps!




Join us in celebrating another wonderful World Book Day. Lots to look forward to including a live author workshop, competitions, fashion parade and book trail and some book speed dating!
