Congratulations to Luke Rutherford for becoming the Brighton and Hove Chess Champion.


Luke runs our lunchtime Chess club and this is the 6th time he has won the tournament.

So many of us cherish the books signed with a personal little illustration from Jamie!



Year 1 trip to Drusillas

On October the 10th Year 1 set off to Drusillas Park, Alfriston for an exciting adventure. The children met education officer James Woodward who provided a hands-on workshop full of experiences for the children to enjoy. The workshop opened with wonderful facts about prehistoric times. The children shared their knowledge and understanding on what we have been learning about during our 'Digging for Dinosaurs' topic lessons.

"My best part of the day was touching the crocodile skin it was lumpy!" Archie.

"I found a real life fossil!" Nico.

"Roarrrrrrr, we are a fierce T-Rex!" Sebastian and Edward.

"I was so brave, I touched the real snake!" Ivy

We also met an unusual mammal, with a soft hairy tummy, a pink face, a little black nose and a name that translates to 'little armoured one' can you guess? She was a very friendly, hairy armadillo!

We were very fortunate to meet one of the oldest terrestrial species that lived alongside the dinosaurs and beyond, the Madagascan hissing cockroach. The children observed his hard, shiny plates which forms his exoskeleton, made of chitin, and his amazing sticky legs that enabled him to hang upside down on James' finger!

Throughout the day, we met a whole host of endangered species and compared fur, feather and scales. Drusillas marked their endangered species' enclosures with a conservation and education in action sign, which the children observed and stamped in their books on the way around the park. Amongst these endangered species were the Sulawesi crested macaque, the Black lemur, and a ring-tailed lemur.

I would like to say a very big thank you to James and all the keepers at Drusillas for providing us with such an educational encounter with our natural world. We hope to come and visit again soon!

Park considerately

Consider walking part of the way to school or share the school run with other parents

... meaning fewer cars at the school entrance

... making it safer for you and your children.

If you need to drive your child to school

For the safety of your child, their friends, and the local community we request that you park safely, legally and considerately. This means not parking on single or double yellow lines; not double parking, not stopping or dropping off on the School Keep Clear yellow zig zags or pedestrian crossing white zig zag lines; not parking on corners or junctions near the school entrance; not blocking driveways.

What can I do instead?

Try "Park and Stride" – park away from the school entrance and walk the last 5 or 10 minutes. Walking half a mile only takes between 8 and 17 minutes. How many calories you burn depends on how fast you walk!

Try a "Walking Bus" – organise a small group of parents to share the walk to school and take it in turns with other parents to do the school run. You could even combine this idea with Park and Stride.

Walking to school contributes to the recommended daily physical activity for you and your children. It also helps to reduce congestion around the school and helps to improve air quality, providing benefits for everyone.

Try Car Sharing – if you have to drive to school then get together with other parents who need to go by car and take it in turns to drive.

You could start by doing any of these just once or twice a week.
