Talk, think, read, write	Design and create	Let's perform
<p><b><u>Past and Present</u></b>                      We have been learning about Judaism in RE. Can you find a synagogue in Brighton? You can explore using Google maps. Draw a picture of a synagogue and write 5 facts about it. Some example questions you can explore to help you with your homework: how old is the synagogue? Why do people visit a synagogue? When do people visit a synagogue? What importance does it have in the Jewish faith? What features does the synagogue have?</p>	<p><b><u>Landmark – futuristic</u></b>                      Design and make a futuristic landmark. Think about what you would like to see built in Brighton in the future.</p> <p>Think carefully about what already exists and what you think might be missing. Bring your design into school and take a photo to stick in your Homework Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Fringe Festival</u></b>                      Every year we have the Fringe festival visiting Brighton, a true celebration of the arts. Imagine you have been chosen to perform at this festival. Create your own play/stand up joke/dance/puppet show. You can either perform to the class or send a video through to the office.</p>
<p><b><u>Entertainment in Brighton</u></b>                      Design your perfect day in Brighton. Where would you have breakfast? Where would you visit? What activities would you do? Where would you have lunch? etc.</p> <p>Optional challenge: keep a running total of cost. Display in your Homework Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Artwork</u></b>                      Using nature, can you create your own piece of art? You can use leaves, rocks, sticks, sand etc. Please make sure you don't use anything living and only use leaves that have already fallen. Take a picture of your artwork and either send to the office or stick into your homework book.</p>	<p><b><u>Habitat</u></b>                      We are fortunate to live by the beach. Can you create a mindmap to show everything that uses Brighton beach as its habitat? You can present the information however you like: use pictures, notes, sentences or a documentary style video. Display in your Homework Book.</p>
<p><b><u>Research</u></b>                      Choose an animal to research and explore how it is adapted to its environment. Some questions to think about are: what features of the animal make it adaptable to its environment? How does it protect itself from predators? What makes it a successful predator? What does it eat?                      Create an information leaflet/poster to show your research. Display in your Hwk Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Computing</u></b>                      Create a poster advertising the ice-skating rink at the Royal Pavilion. Use attractive text, colours and pictures. Think carefully about the words you would use to grab people's attention.</p> <p>Stick in your Homework Book.</p>	<p><b><u>Music</u></b>                      Sit outside somewhere. What sounds can you hear around you? Are they in front of you or behind? Are they close or far away? Do they follow a regular beat or happen every so often?                      Create a 'sound map' of the things you can hear around Brighton and Hove. You'll be surprised at the number of things you can hear when you sit quietly!</p>
