	Design and create	QU'EST-CE QUE C'EST?: Design, create and make a game to practise learning the French words for school subjects.	ROYAL PORTRAIT Create a drawing of yourself as a monarch. Think about all elements of your artwork: setting, colour, materials, clothing, hairstyle. You can display your work using a medium of your choice. Photography, painting, drawing, technology. We look forward to displaying your artwork.	MARBLE RUN FUN: Design and make a marble race. Stick different papers and cards across a ramp – try sandpaper, corrugated card, foil or tissue paper. Hold marbles at the top of the ramp, one marble for each type of paper. Release the marbles and see which one reaches the bottom of the ramp first!

This could include street names, statues or memorials, post boxes, buildings etc. Present your findings how you wish – it could be photographic, sketch, report, map etc.	UP IN THE AIR: Find out about different seeds that make use of air resistance to travel. Look at sycamore seeds or dandelion seeds. Record what you find using pictures/photos or video.
